- The most luxuriously packaged single CDs we've ever done!
- The history of country music told year-by-year from 1945-1970! First, 1945-1950.
- The hits! The classic performances! The truly influential recordings! Painstakingly restored sound!
- The series is compiled and annotated by Grammy winning Colin Escott.

For many years, we've been getting requests to do a truly definitive country series, but it wasn't until the success of our R&B/Soul series, 'Blowin' The Fuse' (now 'Sweet Soul Music') that we decided we needed to do something comparable for country music. Now the first six volumes are complete, taking us from 1945-1950. The country series has been compiled with today's fans in mind. Yes, the big hits are there, but so are the classic performances that weren't necessarily big hits at the time, but became influential in the years ahead. Every volume has incredibly detailed behind-the-scenes stories, fabulously rare photos, and an ongoing history of country music set against the backdrop of the broader American music business. Definitive? You bet!

1945 - includes Spade Cooley's *Shame On You*, Dick Thomas' rarely reissued #1 hit *Sioux City Sue* (written by the guy who wrote *Rock Around The Clock*), Porky Freeman's *Boogie Woogie Boy* featuring Merle Travis, the original version of the beerjoint classic *Drivin' Nail In My Coffin* by Jerry Irby, the original *Guitar Boogie*, as well as classic hits by Gene Autry, Red Foley, Eddy Arnold, Roy Acuff, Ernest Tubb, and many others.

1946 – begins with the Buchanan Brothers' *Atomic Power* and includes the original versions of *Someday (You'll Want Me To Want You)*, *Jole Blon* and *Ruby*, as well as the recordings by Bill Monroe that marked the birth of bluegrass, plus classic hits by Bob Wills, Ernest Tubb, Tex Ritter, The Delmore Brothers, Merle Travis, Roy Acuff, Ernest Tubb, and many others.

1947 – kicks off with Tex Williams' #1 pop and country smash *Smoke! Smoke! Smoke! That Cigarette*, and includes more classics by Eddy Arnold, Roy Acuff (the original *Blue Eyes Crying In The Rain*), Ernest Tubb, Bob Wills, Moon Mullican, Hank Williams, Bill Monroe, Charlie Monroe, and the Delmores, as well as Billy Hughes' fabulously rare *Cocaine Blues* and one of Chet Atkins' first solo hits.

1948 – features all the big hits by Red Foley, Ernest Tubb, Roy Acuff, Bill Monroe, Eddy Arnold etc., but also includes Leon Payne's original version of *Lost Highway*, Bill Carlisle's original *Wedding Bells*, Jimmie Skinner's original *Doin' My Time*, T. Texas Tyler's original *Deck Of Cards*, and Pee Wee King's original *Tennessee Waltz*!


1949 – begins with Vaughan Monroe's eerie *Rider's In The Sky* and ends with another pop-country crossover smash, *Mule Train*. In between, look for more classic bluegrass from Bill Monroe and the Stanley Brothers, as well as Hank Williams' *Lovesick Blues*, Leon Payne's original *I Love You Because*, plus all the classic hits from the big artists like Ernest Tubb, Bob Wills, Floyd Tillman, Eddy Arnold, and Hank Thompson.

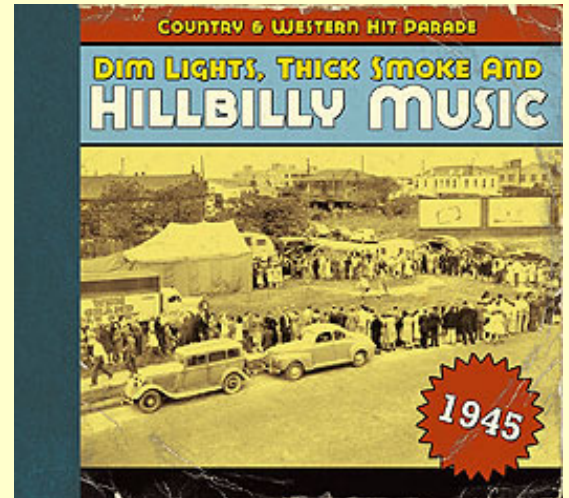
1950 – features the breakthrough recordings by Hank Snow, Webb Pierce, Carl Smith, and Lefty Frizzell plus hits by Hank Williams, Red Foley, Eddy Arnold, Gene Autry, and Ernest Tubb. More classic bluegrass (like the original *Foggy Mountain Breakdown*) and fabulous hard-to-find classics like Billy Starr's *Steppin' Out*, Ole Rasmussen's *Sleepy Eyed John*, and Arkie Shibley's original hot rod classic *Hot Rod Race*.
